

NSRM NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH UPDATE

As you may recall, last fall the NSRM Neighborhood Watch worked with the Ridgely Manor HOAs, the Belmeade Condominium Association, and District 9 city councilman Joash Schulman to have a speed study conducted for two weeks on Ridgely Manor Boulevard. Traffic Engineering did a follow-up speed study and analysis on Ridgely Manor Boulevard in October 2024. The findings indicated that it still meets the conditions for a 35 mph roadway.

Based on the data collected, Traffic Engineering placed two 25 mph signs on Knights Bridge Lane. Prior to this, there were no speed limit signs anywhere within NSRM. This is a positive development and will help ensure drivers are aware of the drop in speed limit from Ridgely Manor Blvd to the roadways in NSRM.

Please do not put trash cans, yard waste, or recycle bins in front of mailboxes, trees, or light poles. It may prevent your trash pickup or mail delivery.



Trash Collection

Put yard waste and trash cans where they are not visible from the street until it is time to put them at the curb on Tuesdays in preparation for the VA Beach City trash pickup. Nothing but vehicles should be on the driveways.

Trash Collection is on Wednesday mornings unless Virginia Beach City states otherwise, such as for holidays.

Recycle bins are collected every other Wednesday. If you have forgotten when the recycle trash is to be collected, go to this link:

https://pw.virginiabeach.gov/trash-recycling/recycling-information and enter your address where you see "My Trash Day" on the left side of the page and click the mouse. The collection day will be displayed.

Curbside bulk/large item pick-up is scheduled by request and collected by City-employed operators in City vehicles, usually on the same day as the trash collection. Call 757-385-4640 to schedule a pickup..

Popovers -- eat them while they're HOT!!!



I suddenly had this strange craving for Yorkshire pudding and I discovered the next best thing – popovers! -- which have similar ingredients but can be frozen to eat another day. However, there are so many recipes with slight variations claiming their popovers rise only if you do a or b, but I needed an eggless version. What you see below is what I came up with for an eggless recipe after many attempts, and it was a hit at home!!!

I also discovered popovers rise better with special baking pans, so I use the one below. The egg-based recipe was included with the popovers, but I had to add ingredients to achieve an eggless recipe using "Just Eggs."






"Just Egg" is a misnomer for this food item – it is actually "No Eggs"!

- It's an egg substitute vegans can use for cooking
- Consider buying it at Wegman's for freshness.
- After opening the carton, discard the contents after 7 days.

Ingredients

- 3 eggs at room temperature before cracking OR
 3/4 cup Just Egg at room temperature
 - ☐ If using Just Egg, add 2 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1 1/2 cups whole milk, room temperature
- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour, sifted
- 1/2 tsp baking soda
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 3TB Avocado oil or other oil that can handle high temperatures (not olive oil)





Directions

- 1. Make sure that Just Eggs/or eggs (before cracking) are at room temperature. Also make sure that the milk is at room temperature before mixing. (I heat the milk and then let it cool for about 15 minutes)
- 2. Sift the flour into a separate bowl. Add the salt, baking powder (if using Just Eggs), and baking soda.
- 3. Using a whisk, mix Just Eggs (or eggs), milk, and salt. Use a standup mixer to slowly blend the flour mixture until smooth. Let batter rest for 30 minutes while you preheat the oven. (Resting the batter results in popovers with an airier texture (as opposed to dense). At least 15 minutes allows the starch molecules to expand and the gluten to relax.
- 4. Preheat the oven to 425°F for a convection oven, and 450°F otherwise. and place the rack in the middle of the oven.
- 5. Place a 6-slot popover pan (see photos on previous page) on a baking sheet; and place 1 tsp of oil in each slot. Put the popover pan on the lower rack of oven for 5-10 minutes after the oven is heated. (You need to use avocado oil or an oil that can withstand a high temperature like 400°F not virgin olive oil.)
- 6. Remove the pan from the oven and rapidly pour the rested batter evenly into the muffin slots, filling them up to 2/3 or 3/4 full, and then put the popover pan into the middle of the oven.
- 7. Bake the popovers for 15 minutes WITHOUT OPENING THE OVEN DOOR.
- **8. WITHOUT OPENING THE OVEN DOOR**, reduce the oven temperature to 325°F for a convection oven, and 350°F otherwise. Bake the popovers for 10 to 15 minutes more. Wait until popovers have "popped" over the tops of the pan, and are a deep, golden brown.
- 9. Popovers lose their crispiness and become soggy if they linger in the pan, so turn them out on a wire rack <u>immediately</u> and make a small slit in the side of each with a paring knife to let the steam out.
- 10. Serve popovers with butter. Enjoy!!!
